

# **Civil Enforcement Officer**

#### What is it?

A Civil Enforcement Officer (CEO) is responsible for ensuring that parking regulations and other civil enforcement laws are followed. They issue penalty charge notices (PCNs) to vehicles that are parked illegally or in violation of local council regulations.

### **Qualifications/Experience Required:**

No formal qualifications required, but GCSEs (or equivalent) in English and Maths are beneficial. On-the-job training is provided, often including a Level 2 Certificate in Civil Parking Enforcement. A valid driving licence may be required for mobile enforcement roles.

Good customer service experience is an advantage. Knowledge of traffic regulations and local laws is essential.

#### What the Work Involves:

- Patrolling streets and car parks to ensure parking regulations are followed.
- Issuing penalty charge notices (PCNs) to vehicles breaking the rules.
- Advising the public on parking regulations and restrictions.
- Dealing with challenging situations and resolving conflicts.
- Keeping accurate records of enforcement actions and incidents.
